SUBJECT: Policy Guidelines on the Development of Quezon Resettlement Project No. 3

Proclamation No. 196 dated 10 December 1987 created the Quezon Resettlement No. 3 and set aside an area of approximately eleven thousand (11,000) hectares of public agricultural lands in Real, Quezon for development. The Proclamation likewise provided that administration and management of the settlement shall be the responsibility of the Department of Agrarian Reform.

The development of the Quezon Resettlement No. 3 shall be pursued consistent with the overall framework of the Comprehensive Agrarian Reform Program and shall seek to give meaning to the land-to-the-tiller concept and promote the establishment of a viable agrarian community.

In view hereof, the following guidelines governing the development of Quezon Resettlement No. 3 are hereby issued:

1. The settlement development plan shall take into account the primordial concerns of tenurial improvement, provision of support services and the promotion of CARP beneficiary organizations;
2. As far as practicable, the preparatory planning activities shall adopt a participatory approach as well as ensure the involvement and participation of the farmer beneficiaries, farmer groups, local government officials and non-government organizations;
3. The DAR Regional Office No. 4 shall administer the settlement project and oversee the overall development effort;
4. Support service requirements such as, financial assistance, agricultural extension, etc. for the CARP beneficiaries shall be drawn from available sources e.g. Land Bank, Department of Agriculture, and other government and private institutions following existing inter-agency linkages established by the CARP.
5. Whenever applicable and practicable, alternative ownership arrangements such as corporate, collective and cooperative farms shall be encouraged within the scope and intent of the CARP.
6. Land clearing of areas earmarked for community sites as well as farmlots shall be undertaken following the parameters set out in the area development plan and in accordance with existing guidelines and procedures

jointly formulated by the DAR and the DENR.

7. Livelihood development projects may be pursued on a pilot basis and may be proposed for funding from foreign or local sources to enhance the overall economic viability of the settlement, and
8. The DAR Regional Office may hire additional personnel to support the requirements of the settlement project in accordance with existing DAR policies and regulations.

This Order shall take effect immediately. 10 March 1988.
