This Supplemental Bid Bulletin No. 1 is issued to amend certain provisions of the Request for Proposal and to address the queries of the short-listed service providers that were raised during the pre-proposal conference that was held on December 8, 2017 relative to the above-mentioned subject.

Question/Clarification	Response to issues raised
In reference to II Scope and Services Management activities such as assessments of the outcome results of the high value vegetable production, the cacao production and marketing tie ups with KFI? Question/Clarification: Do they have a baseline and can we get a copy What other products/crops involved? Will projects to be considered target	KFI tie up was just mentioned as an example, thus it is not necessary to get the baseline data of this project. The main focus of the KM will be on value adding enterprises supported by ARCP2 & partner agencies. Attached are list of products (Please see attached – Annex A)
In reference to II Scope and Services 1 Assessment on ARCP II project • What are these projects and areas? What level of assessment and specific format?	We are referring to the conduct of the End of Project Assessment seminar-workshop to be participated by key officials & concerned technical personnel of DAR from ARCP2 covered provinces. We leave it to the BDS to design the format of the assessment for ARCP2 approval.
3 cross project visits to successful agrienterprises (1) How many areas to be covered for the visit?	The BDS should be able to conduct at least 1 cross visit per island covering all ARC clusters assisted by ARCP2.
3 video documentaries • What is the format of the documentaries? What is the expected output? Length? Style of presentation? Preferred examples we can use as reference? Per case study?	We expect the BDS to prepare the framework, story line, script, and length of the 3 video documentaries in consultation with the NPCO. As a recommendation, follow the standard length of video produced by government and private agencies on rural development projects.

One publication of the ARCP II experience • Format of the document? Why do they mean by publication? Printed? Electronic? Book type? Magazine? Report Format?	The publication is book type, both printed and electronic. We expect the BDS to recommend the format for ARCP2 approval.
Item 4: Coordinate with ARCP II national, regional and provincial management staff regarding activities. • Do we ask for permission before proceeding? Effect of delays due to slow response? Coordination with DAR? Or DAR will coordinate first before we proceed?	Based on agreed activities in the inception report, as finalized with DAR field offices and NPCO, the BDS can already proceed to conduct the said activities; just inform the concerned DAR officers.
Item 7: submit corresponding accomplishment reports to NPCO • Is this different from the progress reports to be submitted? Every month?	The accomplishment reports to be submitted to the NPCO are the same reports to be submitted to DAR field offices.

Is this a separate document?	Yes, the approved case studies framework is a separate document from the inception report. The inception report discusses specific activities and outputs while the case studies selection criteria and framework can only be prepared after discussion with NPCO & DAR field offices

The BDS can coordinate with DAR and other stakeholders during the conduct of the Provincial Multi-stakeholders meeting. This has been institutionalized in DAR, which has been proven to be a good strategy in ensuring support and cooperation of agencies/organizations to achieve desired objectives and sustainability.
