MINISTRY MEMORANDUM CIRCULAR NO. 9 '82
Series of 1982

TO : Bureau Directors, Chiefs of Services
and Regional Directors

SUBJECT : REGIONAL CONFERENCES TO IMPLEMENT THE
CURRICULUM MATERIALS ON AGRARIAN
REFORM (PHASE II)

1. For information and appropriate action, the Ministry of Agrarian Reform, in cooperation with the Ministry of Education, Culture and Sports, will conduct regional conferences in connection with the nationwide implementation of instructional materials on Agrarian Reform developed for elementary, secondary and higher education levels for integration into appropriate subject areas in the educational system of the country. Details for the activity are outlined in the attachment to this memorandum.
2. Instructional materials developed for the following academic grade levels shall be fully implemented during the current school year 1982-83:
 - a. Higher Education - English Modules 1 to 10 and Instructor's Manual
 - b. Secondary Education - First, Second, Third and Fourth Year Teachers' Guides
 - c. Elementary Education - Kindergarten Posters, Grade One, Two and Three Readers and Manuals; Grades Four, Five and Six Teachers' Guides and Accompanying Posters
3. The scope of implementation shall be limited to one class for each of the specified academic grade levels in all schools of provinces/cities in each region involved in the Phase II implementation.

4. Members of the MAR-MECs Curriculum Committee who will conduct the regional conferences are organized into Teams, representing the Ministry of Education, Culture and Sports, College and Ministry of Agrarian Reform. Participants and other personnel involved in this regional conferences are listed in the enclosure to this memorandum.
5. The Ministry of Education, Culture and Sports, under a separate Memorandum has authorized the conduct of this activity. Accordingly, all the regional directors are hereby requested to coordinate with their local counterparts from the Ministry of Education, Culture and Sports in the successful conduct of the regional activity and provide such support as may be necessary.
6. The Agrarian Reform Education Service (ARES) will assist each region with two thousand five hundred pesos (P2,500.00) from FARE for regional expenditures in connection with this activity.
7. Compliance with this Memorandum is earnestly enjoined.

- C. Implement the instructional materials on Agrarian Reform developed for the elementary, secondary and higher levels of education;
- D. Involve the educational sector in the effective implementation of the Agrarian Reform Program; and
- E. Distribute the instructional materials on Agrarian Reform for implementation in all schools of the provinces/cities involved in each region.
