The Provincial Anti-Red Tape Committee shall:

1. Establishment of Anti-Corruption Complaint Center or Hotline
2. Provincial Anti-Corruption Committee shall act on reports/complaints involving public officials within its jurisdictions; and
3. Oversee, communicate, and coordinate with the respective ACCC within the agency
4. Provincial Focal person is any officer in its jurisdiction who shall act as liaison and shall maintain contact with the other members of the ACCC as well as the secretariat of the ACCC. He/she shall maintain records of correspondence to and from its jurisdiction.
5. Reports of regions/provinces shall contain updates and statistics on the proposed anti-corruption legislative measures, practices, areas for improvement, and accomplishment.
6. The Committee in its jurisdiction shall coordinate with DAR Anti-Corruption (DAR-AC) Task Force through its Information and Resource Management Office for the proper referral of information and incident reports of corruption and actions undertaken.
7. The Committee in its jurisdiction shall coordinate within the agency, bureaus, and other instrumentalities attached to it for the proper implementation and promotion of anti-corruption measures, policies, and programs. The Committee shall also be responsible for the implementation, monitoring and evaluation of the Action Plan set by parties and shall provide report.

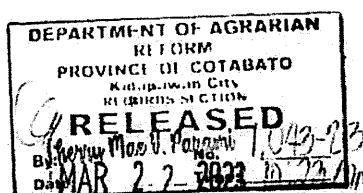
